Another colleague wanted to remind us how awesome our new Walliams teacher, Sarah is - 'She is calm, firm and just really good.' Welcome Sarah.

Finally - Peter has asked me to share this letter with you...

Dear All,

Firstly, I'd like to share my excitement! The playground works are progressing well and some of the first structures are now beginning to take shape. The whole school has responded so well to the disruption, and the noise, and it's so good to hear conversations about this project all over the service. Please be assured that we have sufficient ear defenders available for everyone should they be needed and we are already 2 weeks into the 12-week programme - so we have lots to look forward to as we head on to Easter.

We have also been busy elsewhere on the site and we continue to grow the school's roll. This growth has been mainly in our primary phase in recent months, taking the available spaces in our existing classes. We are currently 111 young people strong and we plan to grow to 125 places by the end of the year, taking full advantage of the new classrooms and facilities we are currently building. Please be assured that we are managing this very carefully, we impact risk assess all new admissions and provide additional support for the transition period, the feedback on this has been very positive to date. We do not plan to grow the school beyond 125 places and taking planned future admissions into account, we are very nearly full for the 2023/24 academic year.

Further to our successful Inspection of the school in March of this year, I am pleased to share with you a change within our leadership team. Pip, our Head of School, takes the new title of Headteacher with effect from the start of January. In many ways, this will have little impact on the day-to-day operation of the school. The title of Headteacher carries additional statutory responsibilities and accountability for Ofsted inspections. This means that you will see Pip's name at the end of our inspection reports and other formal documents going forward, rather than mine. Operationally, I will continue to work closely with Pip and her senior leadership team so that we can maintain our progress in all areas and do the very best we can for all our young people and families.
