Wednesday – Hannah (the second inspector) arrived. Both inspectors did observations around the school, talking to students, watching lessons, talking to staff.

Thursday – More observations around the school and further conversations with students and staff – finishing with looking through evidence and giving feedback.

We aren't able to share the outcome with you yet, as it is subject to a few processes with Ofsted, but rest assured we will share it with you as soon as we are able to. At this stage, we just want to thank:

- You (parents/ carers) for completing the survey and sharing your views
- Students for their responses, meetings, welcoming the visitors and generally being awesome (Ofsted spoke to around 40-50 children during the 3 days).
- Staff for continuing the great work you do every day and showing off all of the fantastic things you help the students achieve in the school.

As a parting thought, one of our favourite quotes from a student this week was "I like doing lessons at this school because I can feel my brain getting bigger".
